Internship Program

-  Our Internship Program (*PAXIP*) witnessed unparalleled growth in 2008 and is becoming impressively competitive. We are thankful for the help our **14** interns have provided the Institute. We could not have been as effective as we were without them.

Publications

-  PAI recently published the second edition of our Institute's first book, *Citizenship Declaration: A Citizen's Call to Action* (Available on Amazon books). Few things are more important than an engaged, educated electorate. All proceeds from book sales are going toward the development of our internship program (*PAXIP*).

-  PAI Fellow Dr. Theodore Hamerow (History Professor Emeritus, UW-WI) has recently published his long-time developing book entitled *Why We Watched: How Anti-Semitism in the Allied Nations Allowed Hitler to Exterminate European Jewry*.
